



Logan City Council collects key economic statistics and information to measure how the city is performing. This information has been compiled into the Bi-annual Economic Analysis Report, July 2019 issue. The most recently released data is presented in this report, but may refer to different time periods depending on the frequency of the data collected by the relevant agency.

KEY ECONOMIC INDICATORS


In terms of overall economic performance and improvement, the City of Logan recorded an increase of 3.9% in Gross Regional Product (GRP) to \$11.77 billion, for the 2017/18 period. The number of new Australian Business Numbers (ABN) being registered in Logan is typically around 500+ per month, with a net increase of 6,588 ABN's in the 2018/19 financial year.

WORKFORCE AND JOBS Emerging industries include: An analysis of the output by industry **Heath Care and** sectors in the City of Logan in 2017/18 **Social Assistance** shows the three largest industries were: \$1.4 billion W/s (+\$471 million over 5 years) Construction \$3.1 billion 14.3% 59.5% **Public Administration** and Safety Rental, Hiring \$954 million and Real Estate 13.2% (+\$211 million over 5 years) **Services** \$2.87 billion Professional, Scientific and 13.0% **Technical Services** \$1.05 billion Manufacturing (+\$211 million over 5 years) \$2.82 billion

HOUSING MARKET

The housing market in Logan remained strong with a 1.3 per cent increase in the value of sales and a slight drop in house sales volume to 3,219 sales. The average time needed to sell a house was 45 days while units took an average of 81 days to sell. The average sale price for houses was \$400,000—an increase of 1.3 per cent for the year.

PROJECT UPDATES

- The Palaszczuk Government, Logan
 City Council and nine key developers
 have signed a landmark agreement
 to deliver \$1.2 billion of essential
 infrastructure for the Yarrabilba
 and Greater Flagstone priority
 development areas (PDAs) over the
 next 45 years.
- The construction of Transurban's \$512m Logan Enhancement Project is nearing completion with the Logan Motorway upgrade officially opened on 19 August 2019. The upgrade to the key intersection of the Logan Motorway and Wembley Road is also nearing completion and already improving freight productivity.
- Construction of the \$6.2 million extension of Third Avenue between Gilmore Road and a new signalised intersection at Wembley Road Berrinba is expected to be completed September 2019.
- Distillery Road Market in Eagleby is now looking for retailers with an expected open late 2020.
- Combined fund of \$10.3 million to deliver projects in Meadowbrook, Logan Central and Jimboomba following Council held summits.
- An \$18.87 million refurbishment and expansion of Logan Hospital's maternity ward, birthing unit and special care nursery to begin this year and be complete by 2021.
